

Hurricane Harvey

On August 25, 2017, Sacred Heart School bore the full force of Hurricane Harvey, a category 4 storm whose sustained winds exceeded 130 miles per hour. As a result, our building sustained major structural and water damage which rendered it unusable, a total loss. Immediate steps were taken to help relocate our displaced students to other schools while newly-constructed temporary campus buildings were procured and installed on Church property just two blocks away. With the help of generous monetary, manpower, and relief assistance provided by Catholic and non-Catholic individuals and organizations, the School was able to open the doors of its temporary home on January 4, 2018, just five months after the storm. Through it all, our dedicated faculty and staff remained together, determined to rebuild and re-establish the School.

At this writing, the future is a bright one for Sacred Heart School. With the promise of a completely new building to replace the old, the continuation of Catholic education in Rockport will be assured for future generations.
